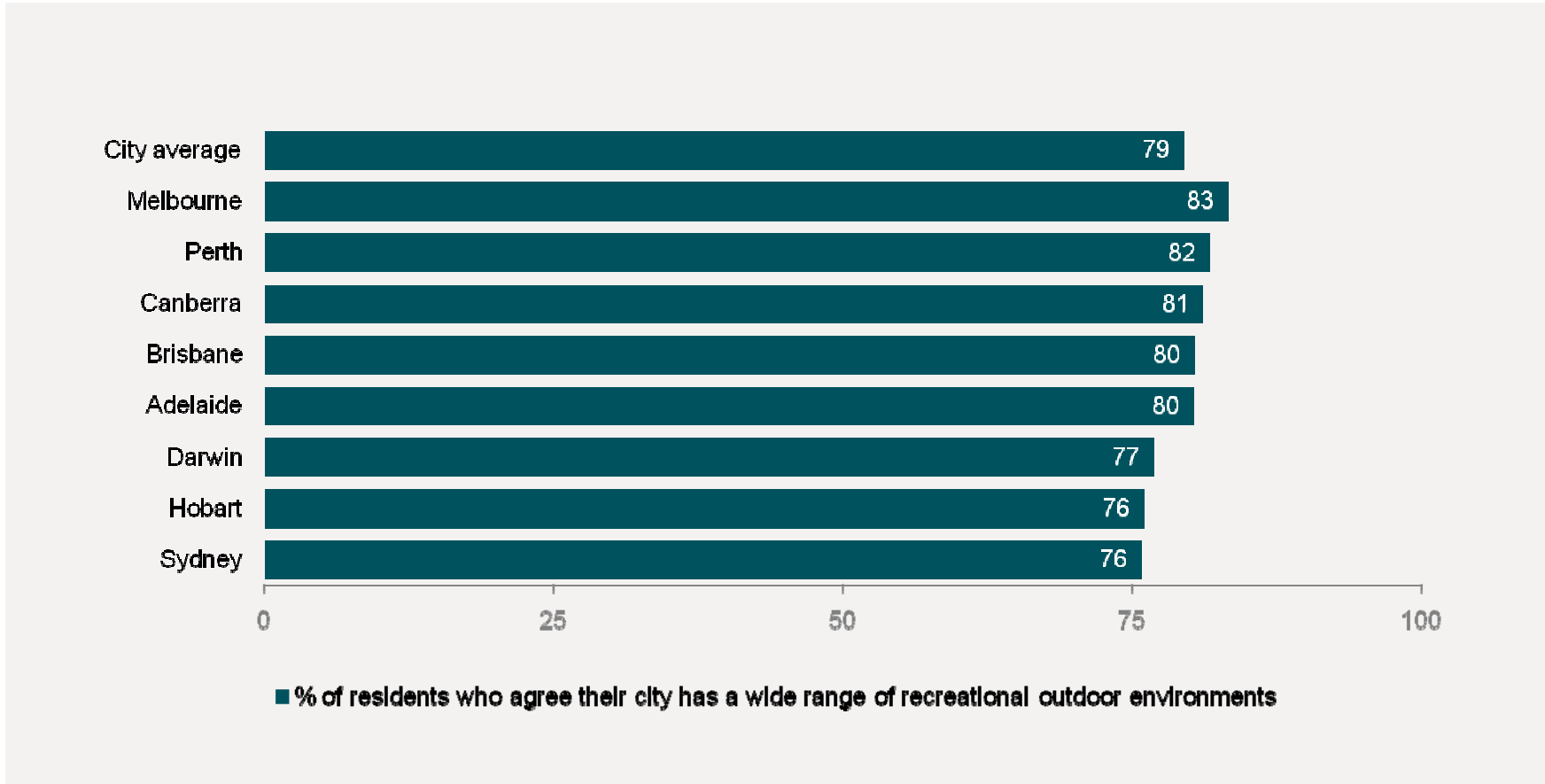


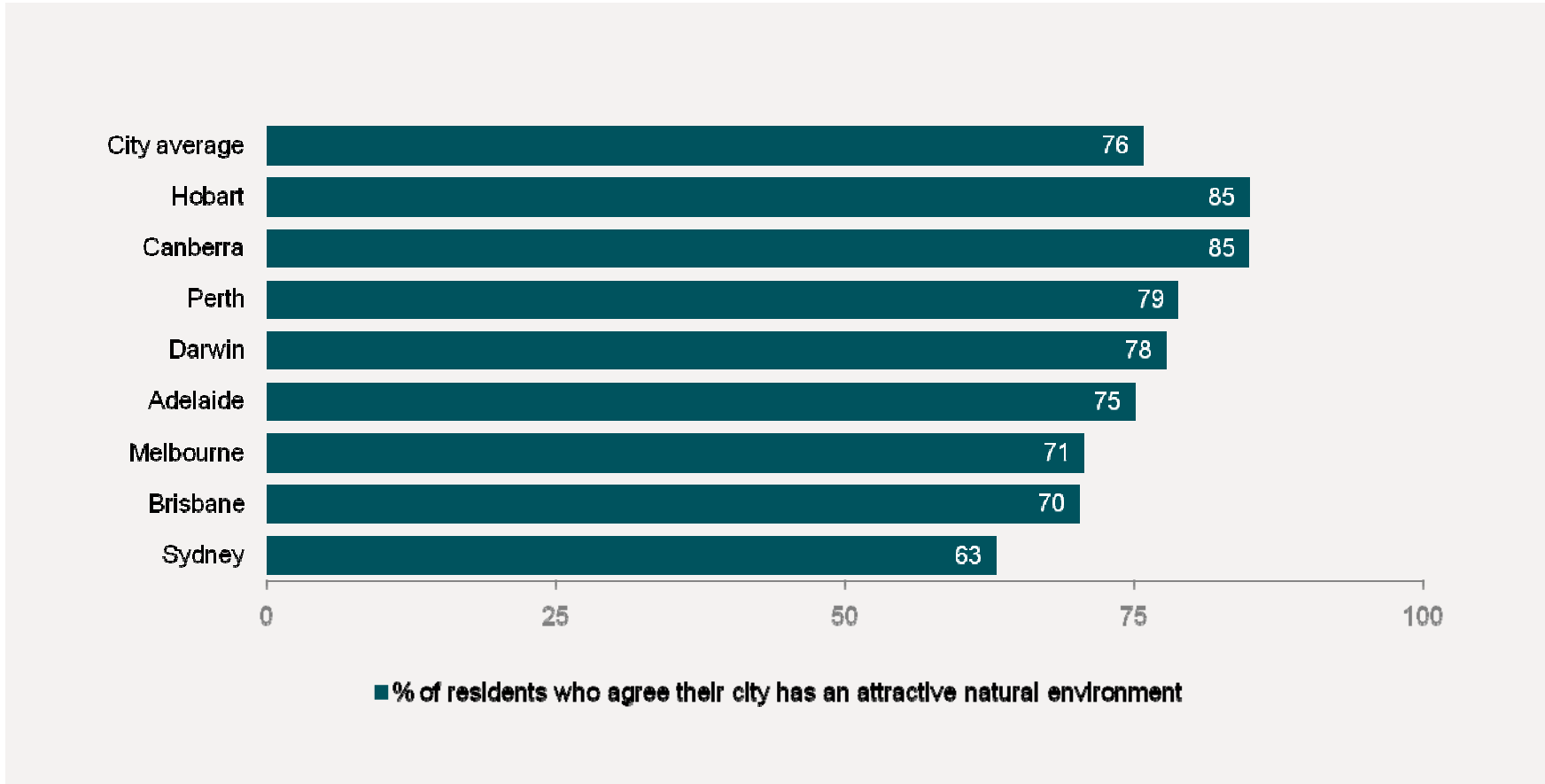
Comparative performance of capital cities on each attribute

Do residents believe their cities have a wide range of recreational outdoor environments?



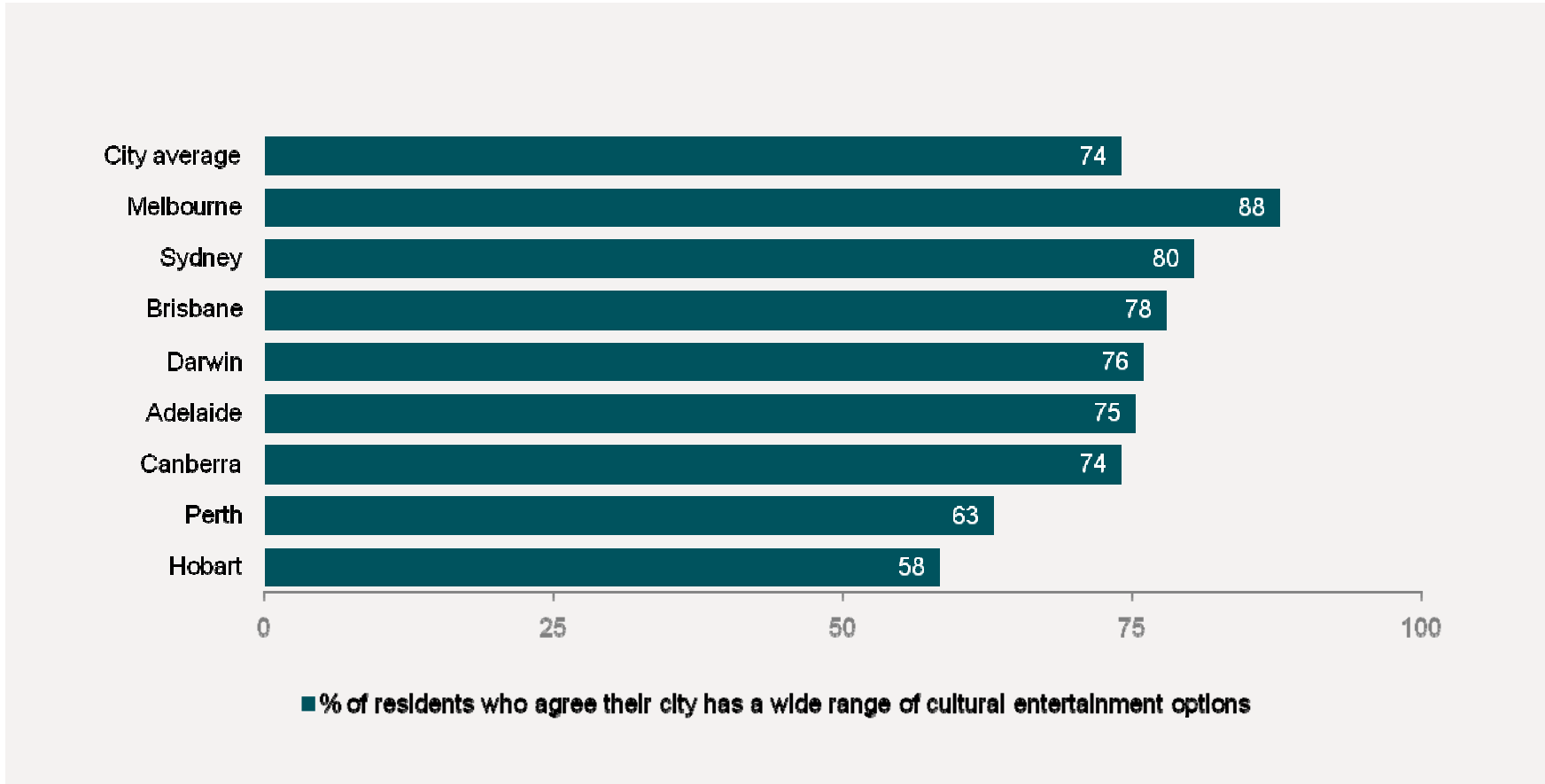
On average almost 4 out of 5 respondents (79%) agree that their city has a wide range of recreational outdoor environments. There was little difference in the performance of cities on this attribute with all cities performing strongly. Melbourne and Perth performed best on this attribute while Hobart and Sydney performed worst in this regard.

Do residents believe their cities have an attractive natural environment?



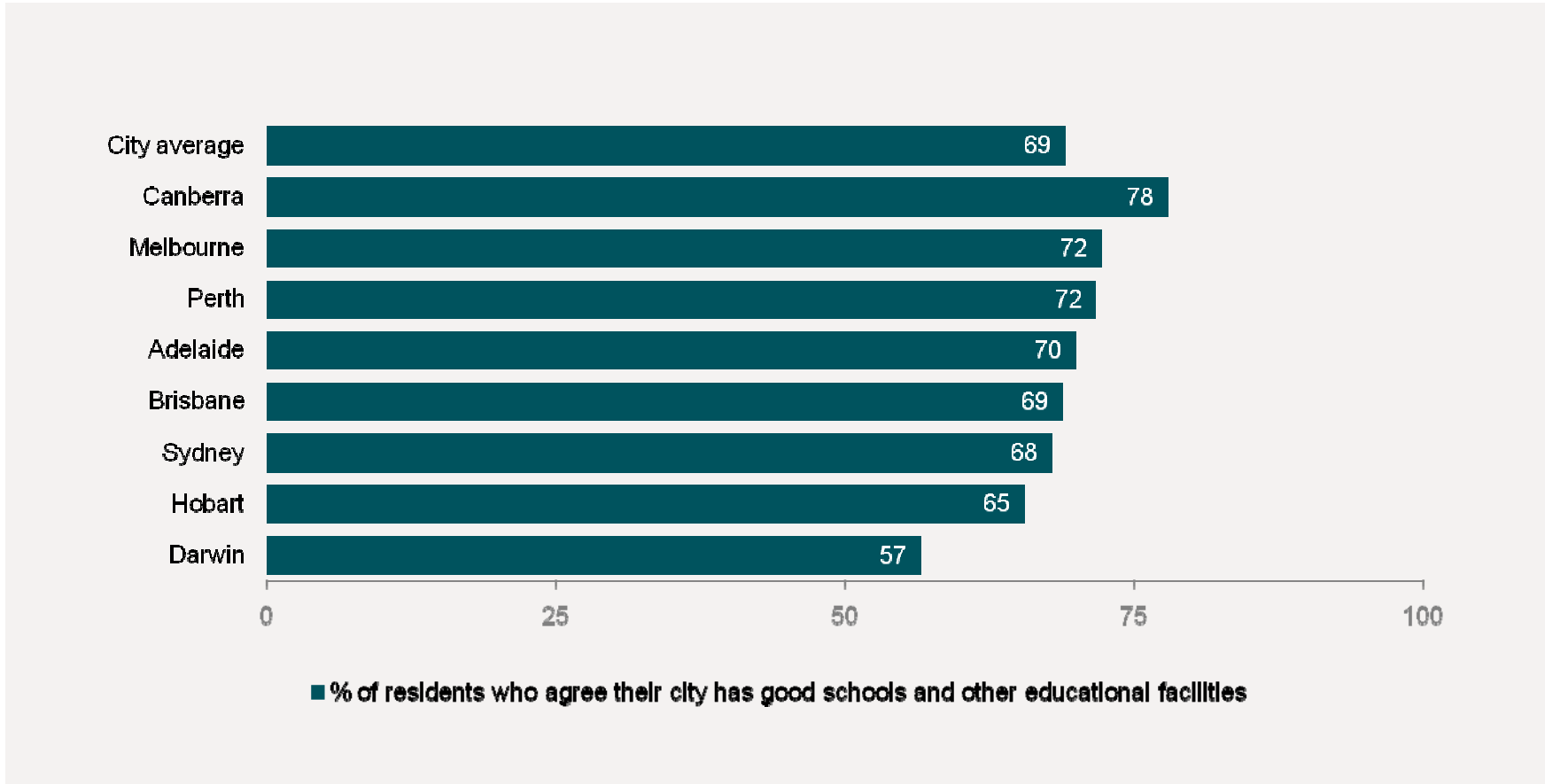
▶ On average 76% of respondents agree that their city has an attractive natural environment with most cities performing well on this attribute. Hobart and Canberra were seen as having the most attractive natural environments while Sydney performed worst in this regard.

Do residents believe their cities have a wide range of cultural entertainment options?



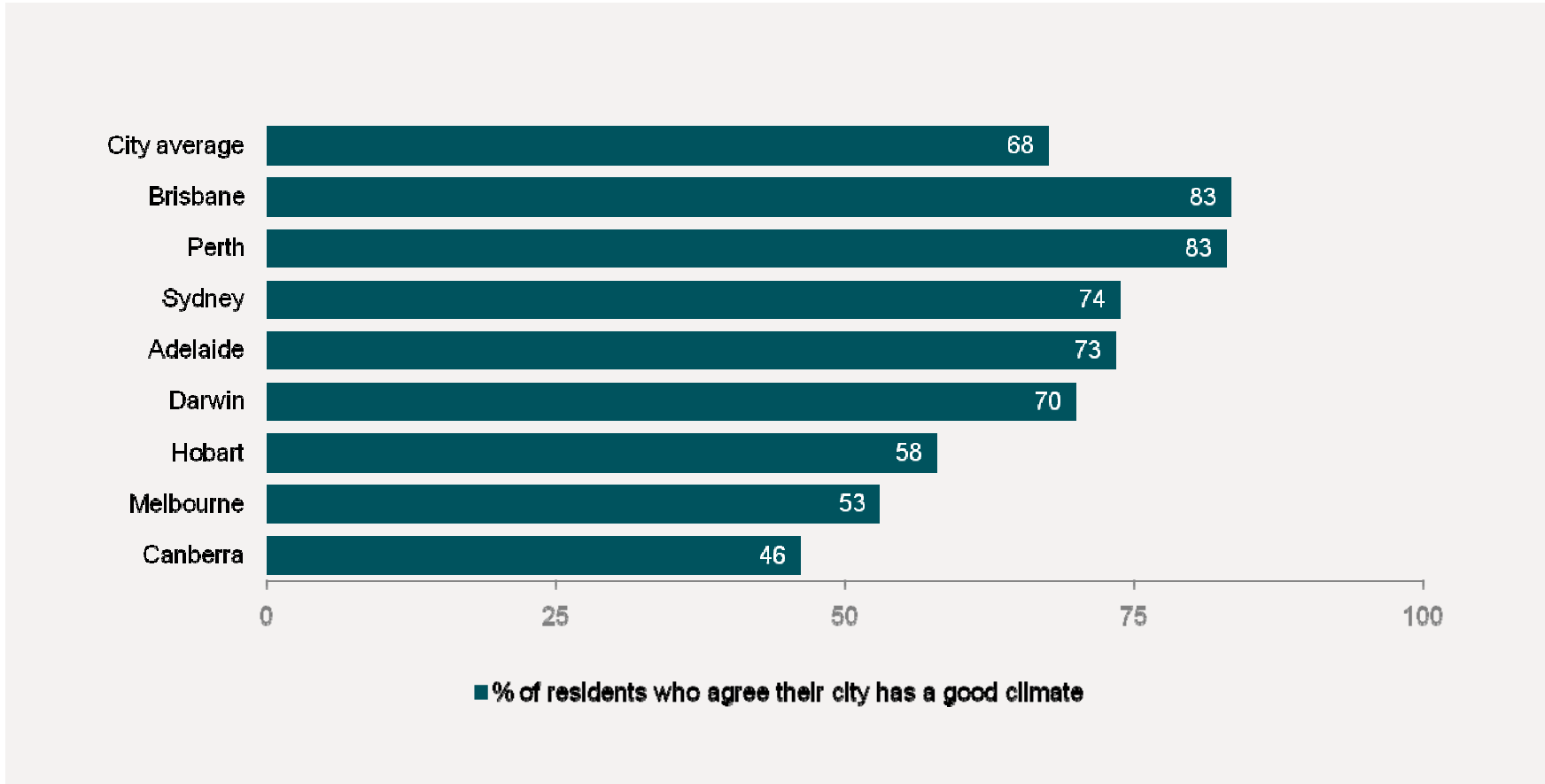
Overall around 3 out of 4 respondents agree that their city has a wide range of cultural entertainment options. There was, however, a notable difference in the performance of cities on this attribute although most performed strongly. With 88%, Melbourne performed best on this attribute while Perth and Hobart performed considerably worse with 63% and 58% respectively.

Do residents believe their cities have good schools and other educational facilities?



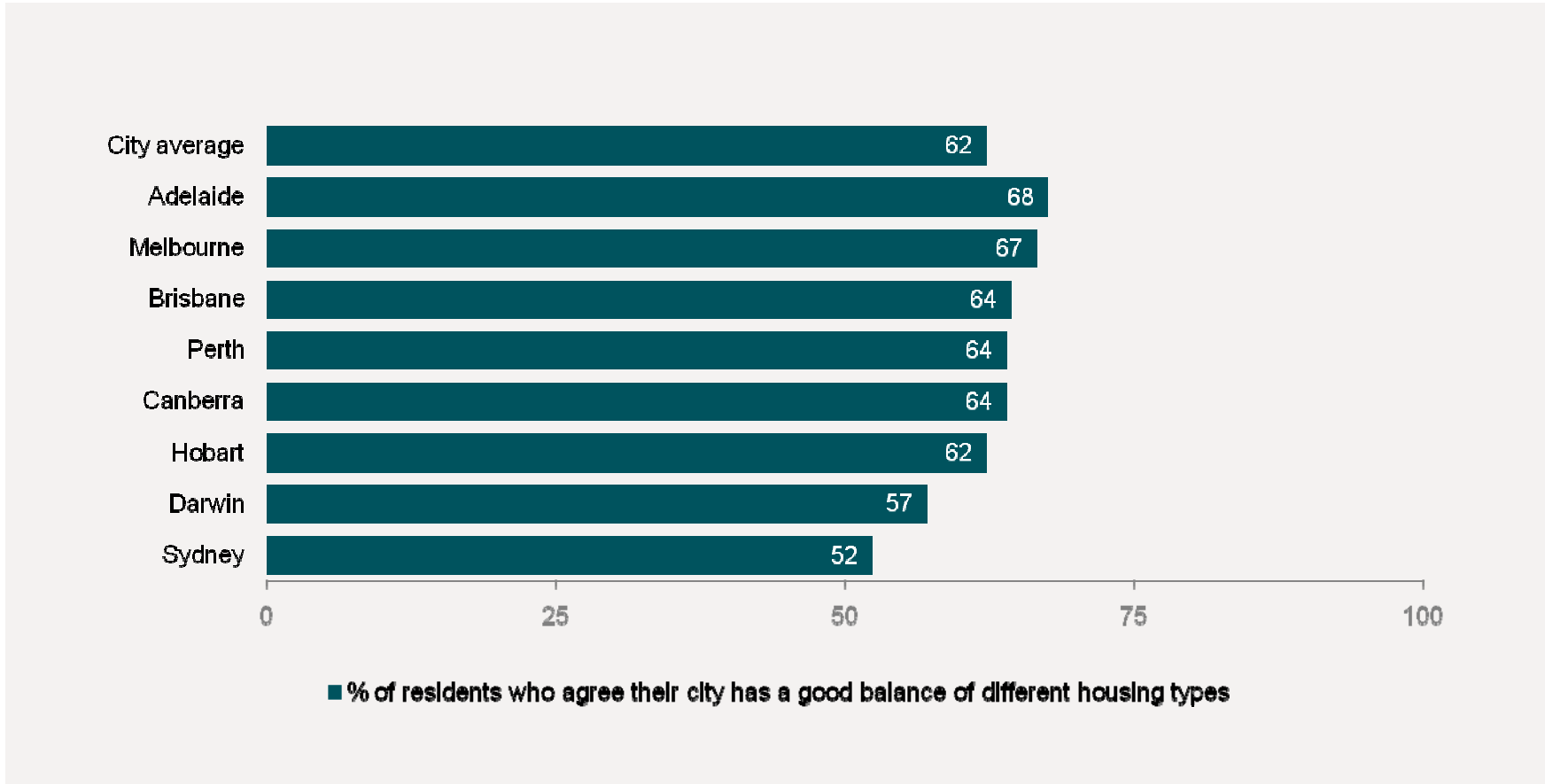
On average 69% of respondents agree that their city has good schools and other educational facilities. Generally, there was little difference in the performance of cities on this attribute with most cities performing well. With 78% Canberra performed best on this attribute while Darwin (57%) performed worst on this attribute by a significant margin.

Do residents believe their cities have a good climate?



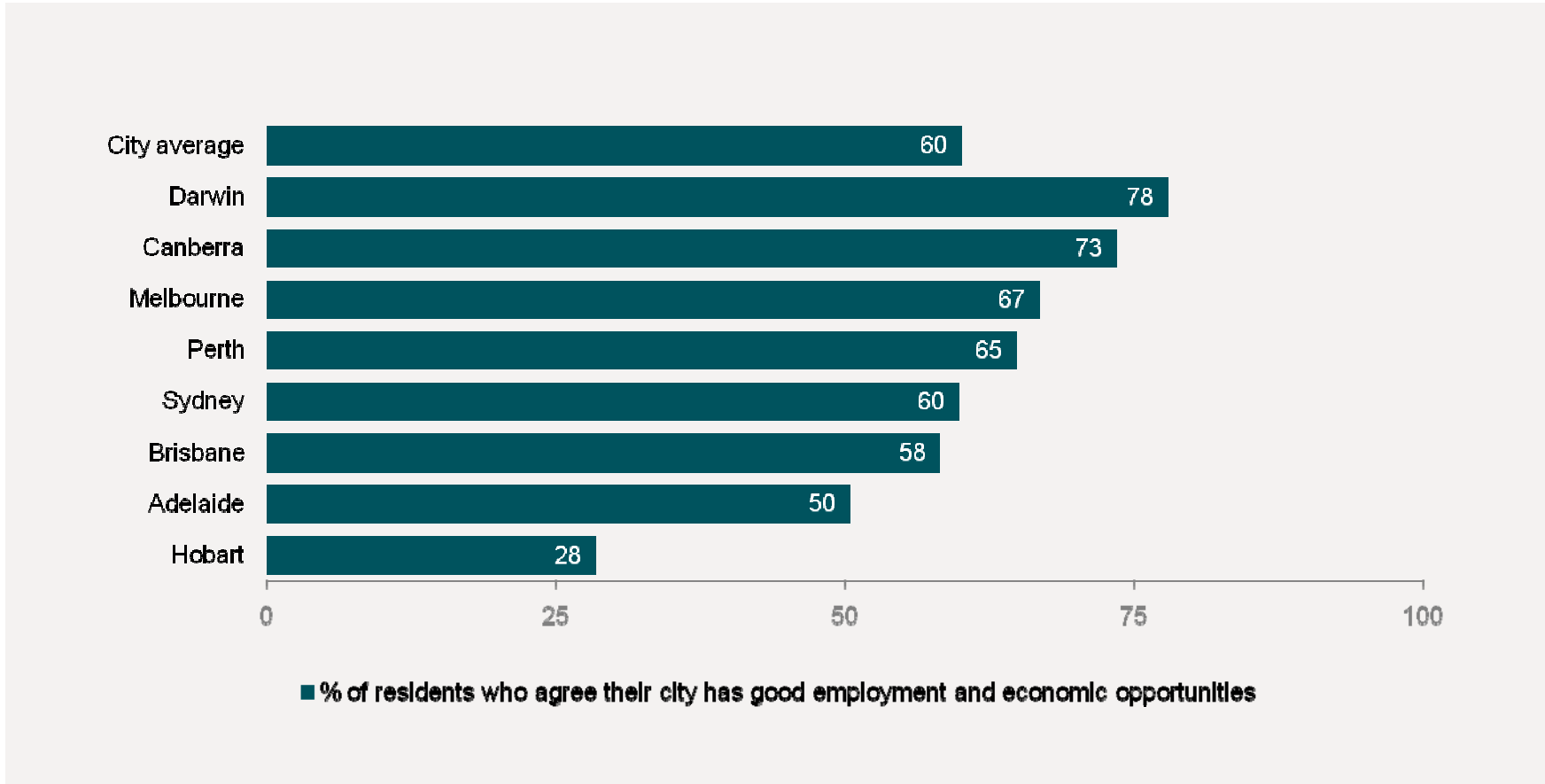
On average 68% of respondents agree that their city has a good climate although there was considerable difference between cities. Brisbane and Perth were seen as having the best climate while Melbourne and Canberra performed worst in this regard.

Do residents believe their cities have a good balance of different housing types?



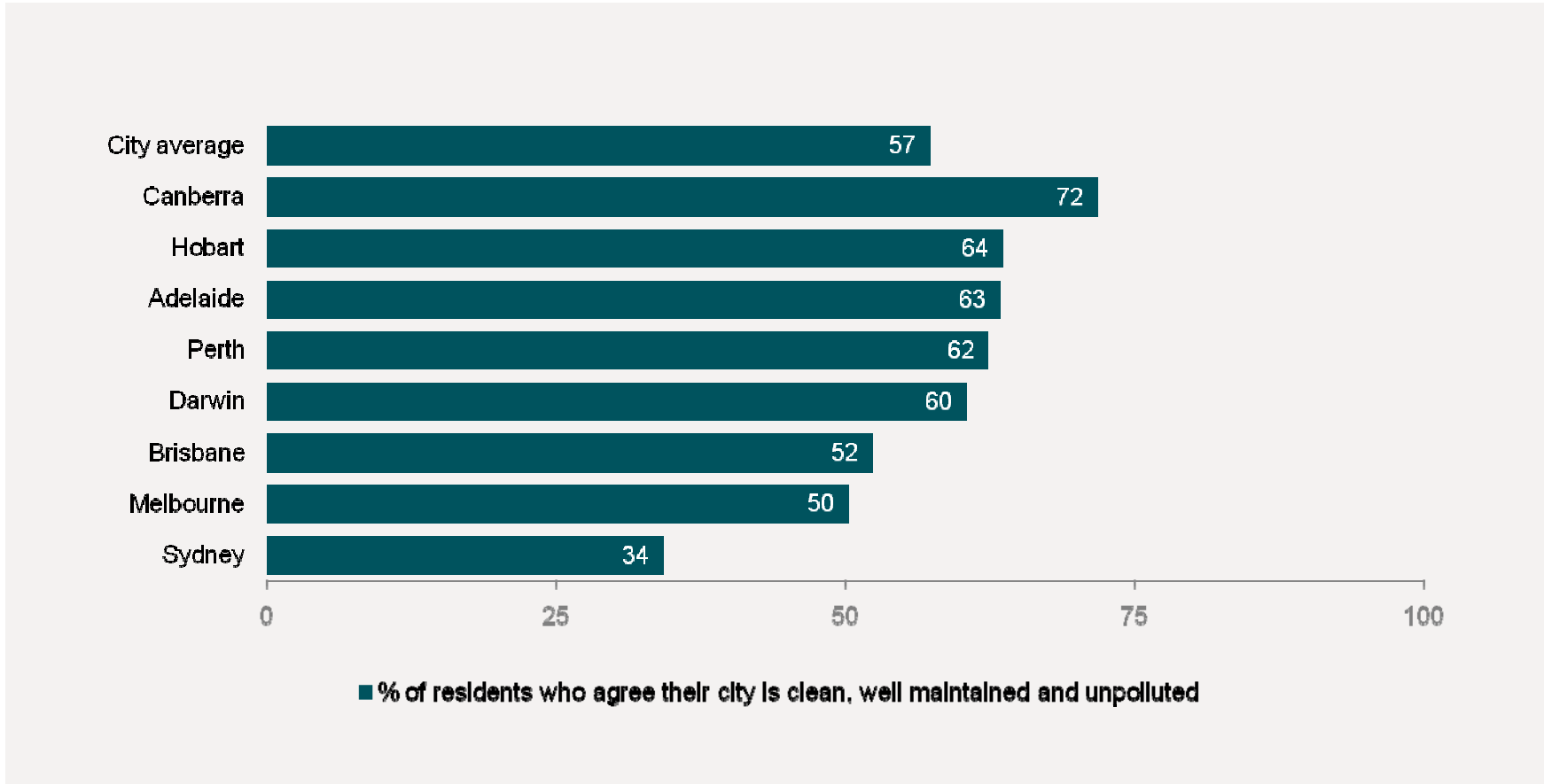
▶ On average over 3 out of 5 (62%) respondents agree that their city has a good balance of different housing types. Overall, there was little difference in the top performing cities on this attribute, with the majority performing strongly. Adelaide and Melbourne performed best on this attribute while Sydney performed worst in this regard.

Do residents believe their cities have good employment and economic opportunities?



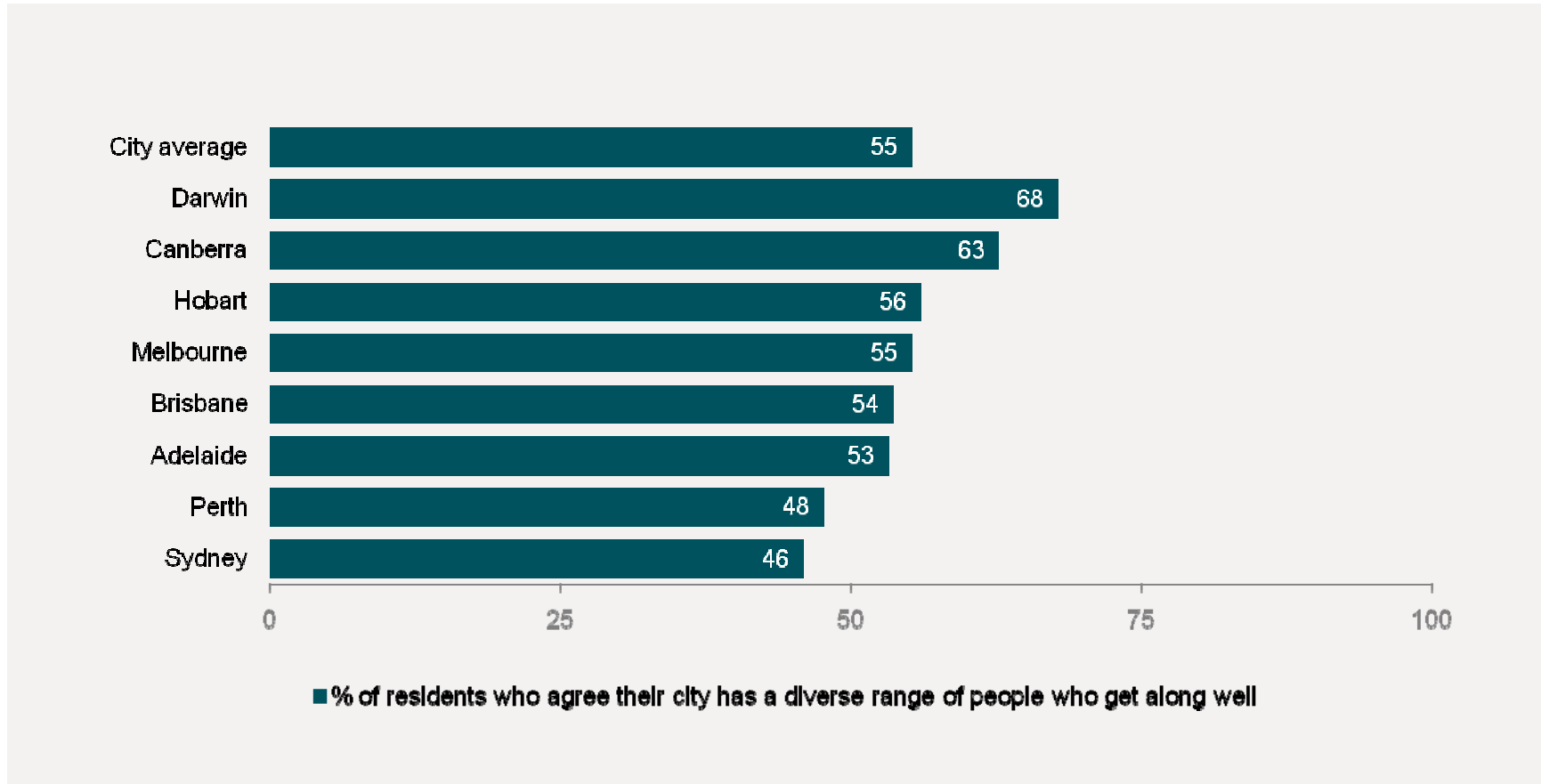
On average 3 out of 5 (60%) respondents agree that their city has good employment and economic opportunities. Most cities performed well on this attribute, however there is a stark difference between the best and worst performing cities. With 78%, Darwin was seen as having the best employment and economic opportunities while with only 28%, Hobart performed the worst in this regard by far.

Do residents believe their cities are clean, well maintained and unpolluted?



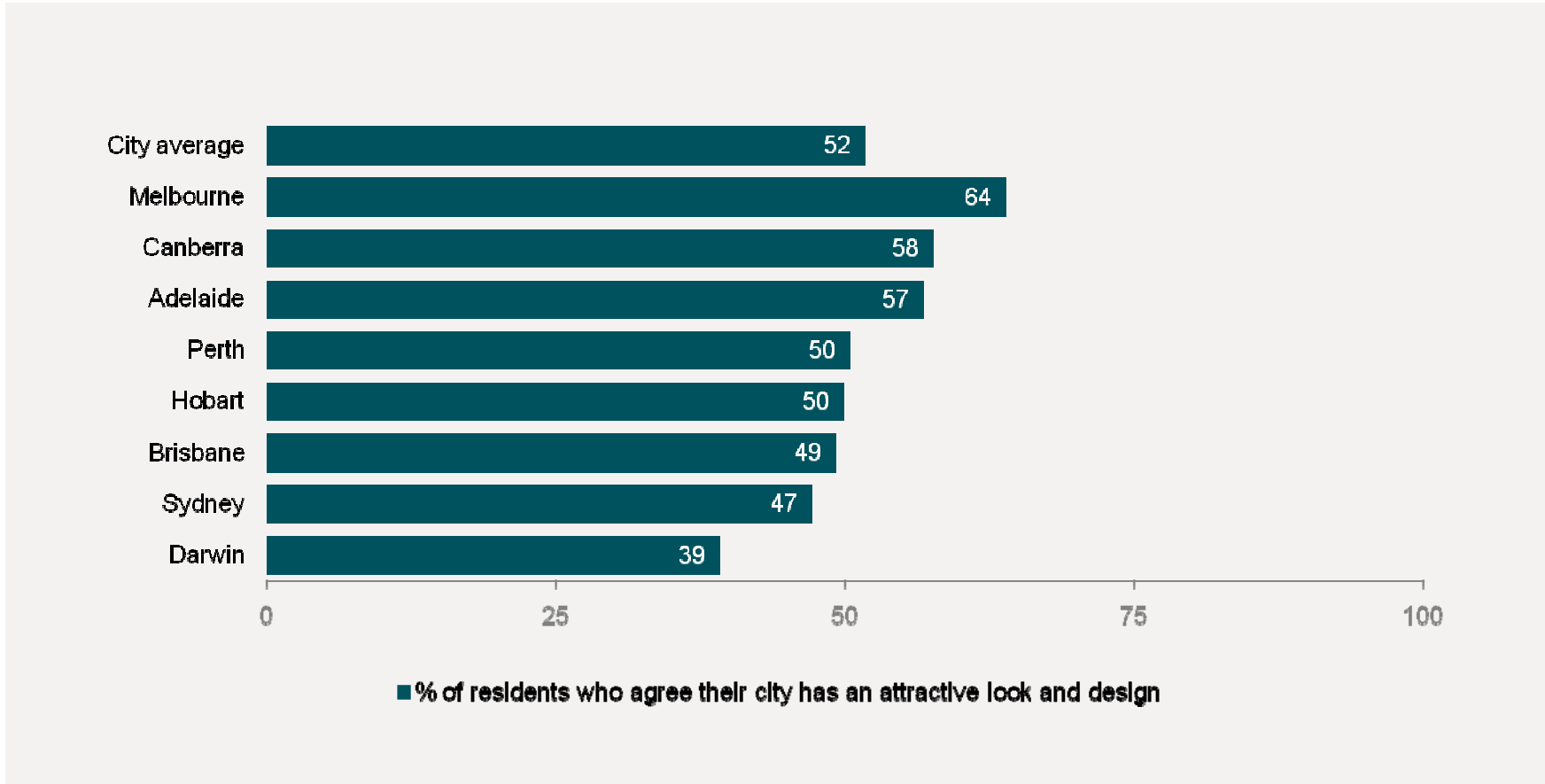
Over half of all respondents (57%) agree that their city is clean, well maintained and unpolluted. Most cities performed above average on this attribute, however there is a stark difference between the best and worst performing cities. Canberra performed best with 72% while Sydney performed worst with only around a third (34%) of its residents agreeing it is clean, well maintained and unpolluted.

Do residents believe their cities have a diverse range of people who get along well?



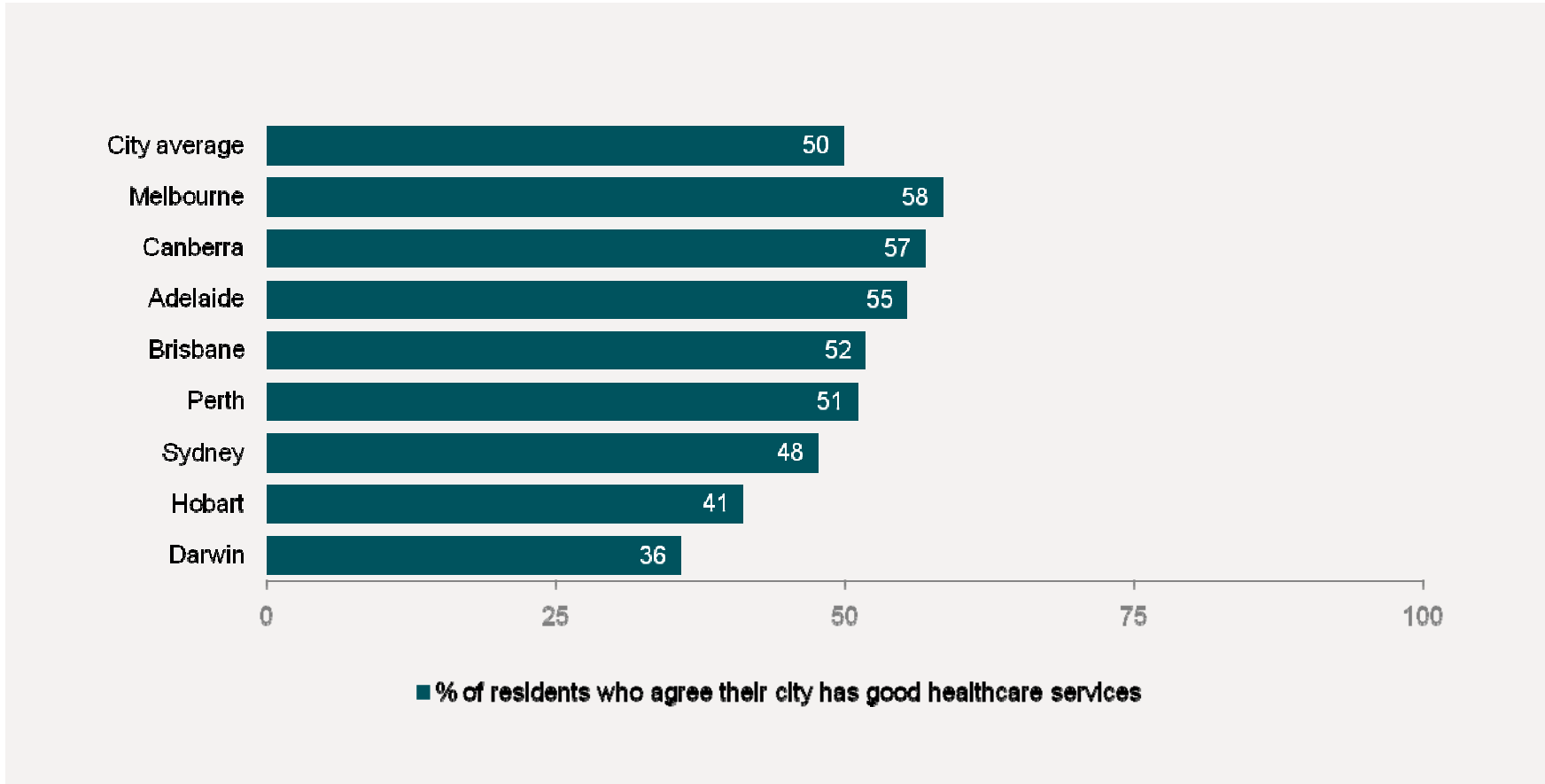
On average over half (55%) of all respondents agree that their city has a diverse range of people who get along well. Darwin and Canberra performed best on this measure of community harmony while Perth and Sydney were seen as the worst performing.

Do residents believe their cities have an attractive look and design?



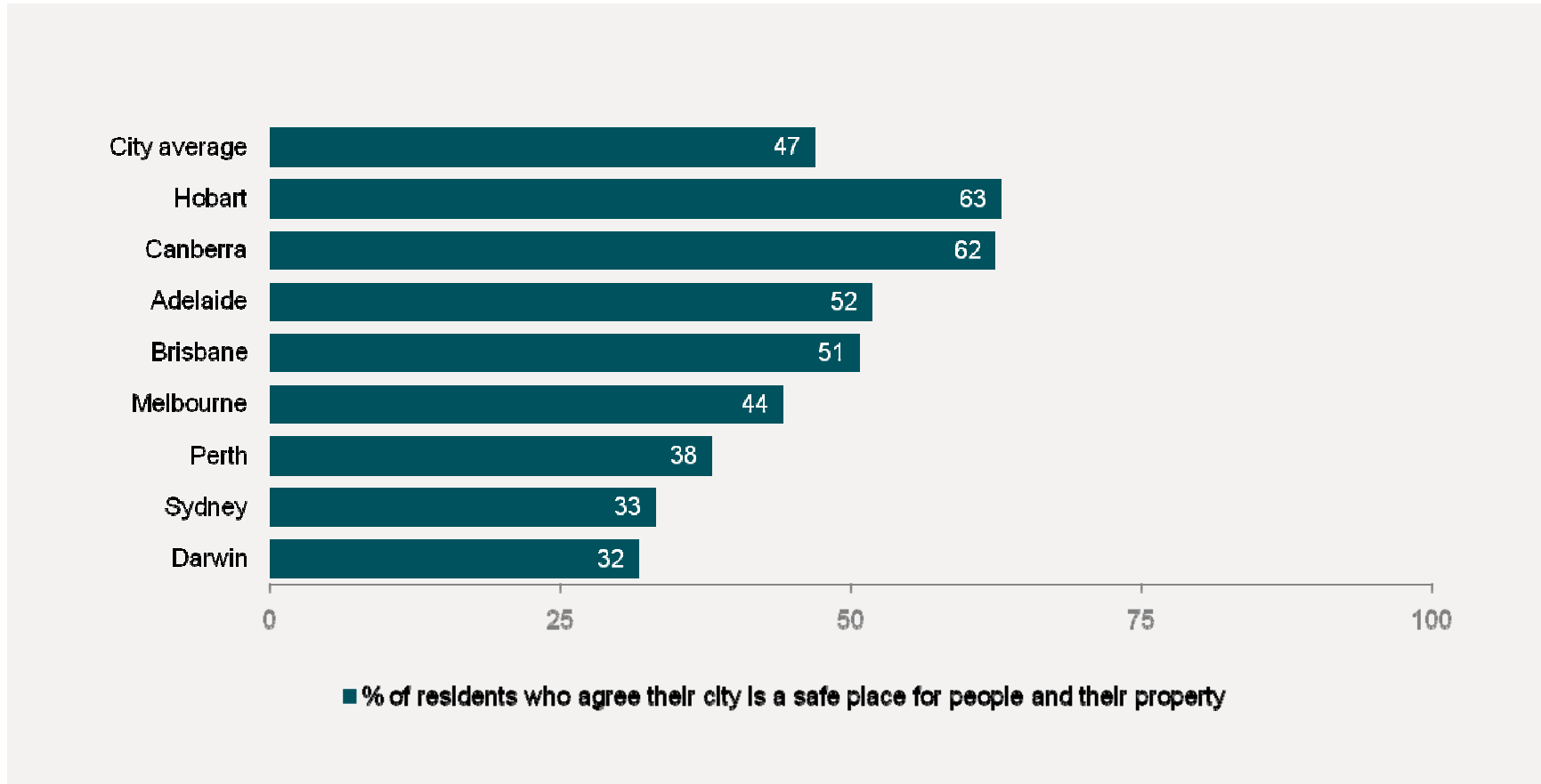
Over half (52%) of all respondents agree that their city has an attractive look and design. There was however, notable variation in the performance of cities on this attribute, with many cities scoring below the city average. Melbourne performed best on this attribute while Darwin performed worst in this regard.

Do residents believe their cities have good healthcare services?



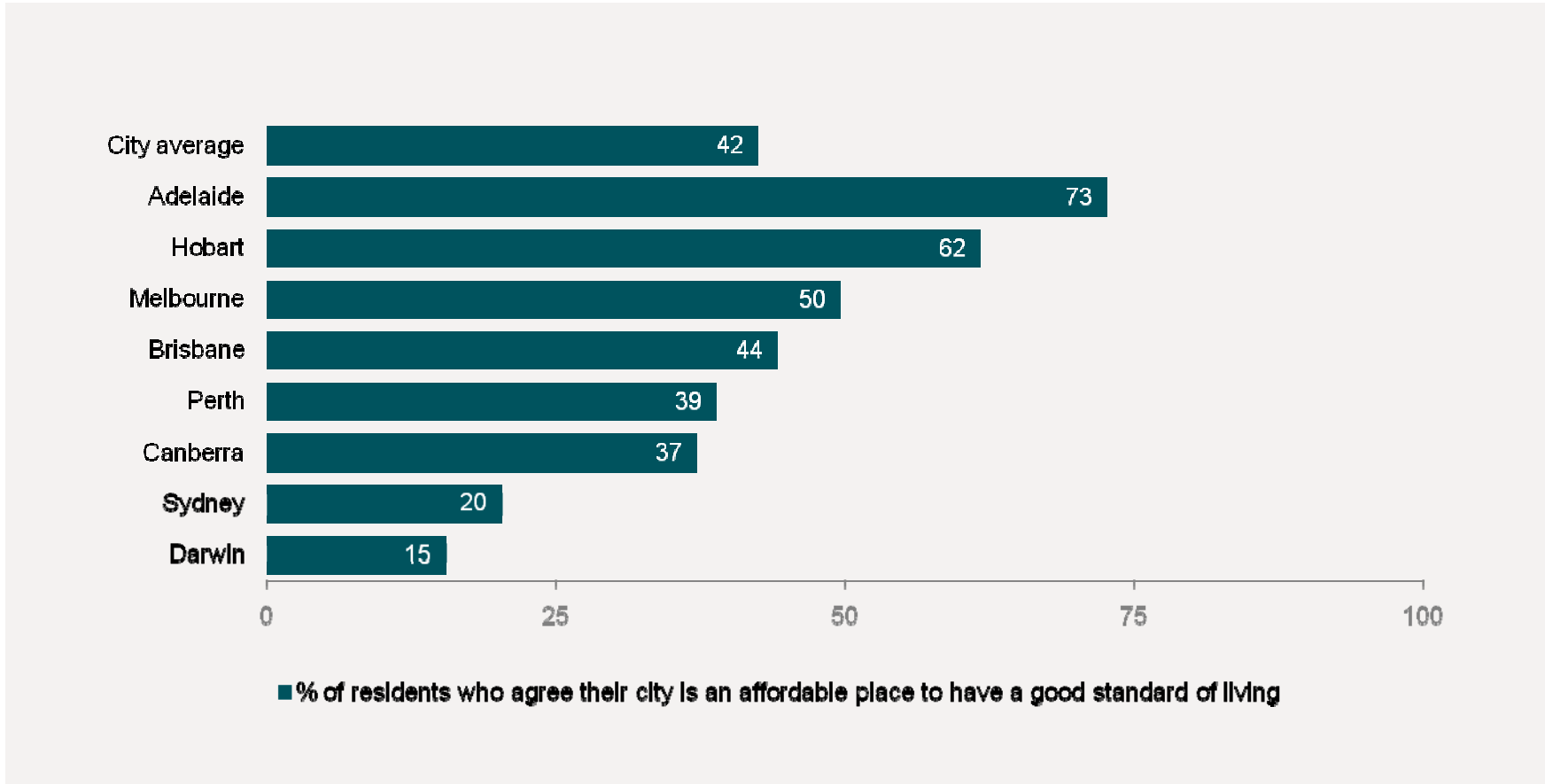
▶ On average, half (50%) of all respondents agree that their city has good healthcare services. Most cities scored over 50% on this attribute: Melbourne and Canberra performing best while Hobart and Darwin were seen as having significantly worse healthcare services.

Do residents believe their cities are safe places for people and their property?



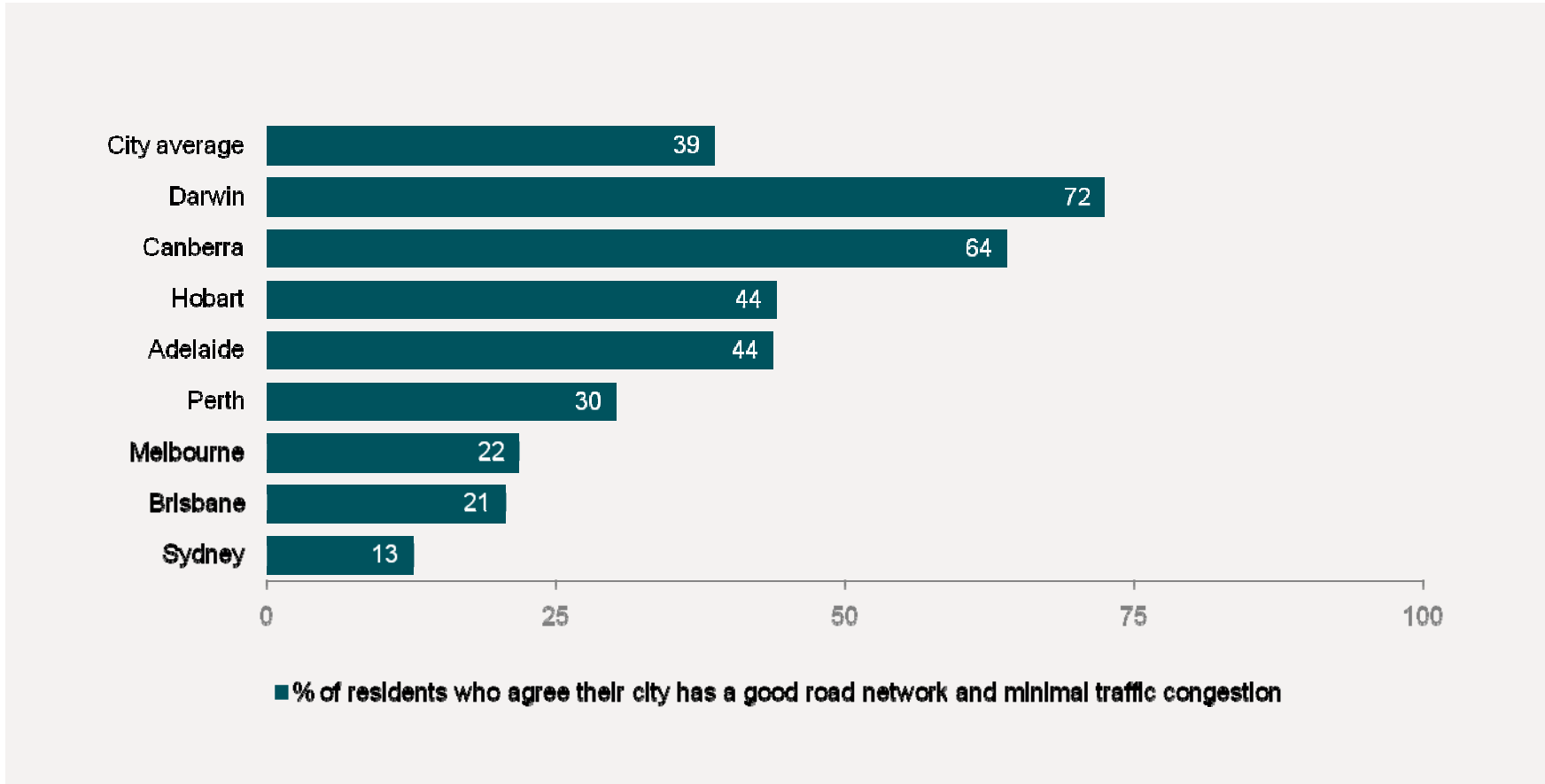
On average only 47% of respondents agree that their city is a safe place for people and their property. Results also show that there are considerable differences in the performance of each city on this attribute. Hobart (63%) and Canberra (62%) are seen as the safest cities while Sydney (33%) and Darwin (32%) are seen as being far less safe.

Do residents believe their cities are affordable places to have a good standard of living?



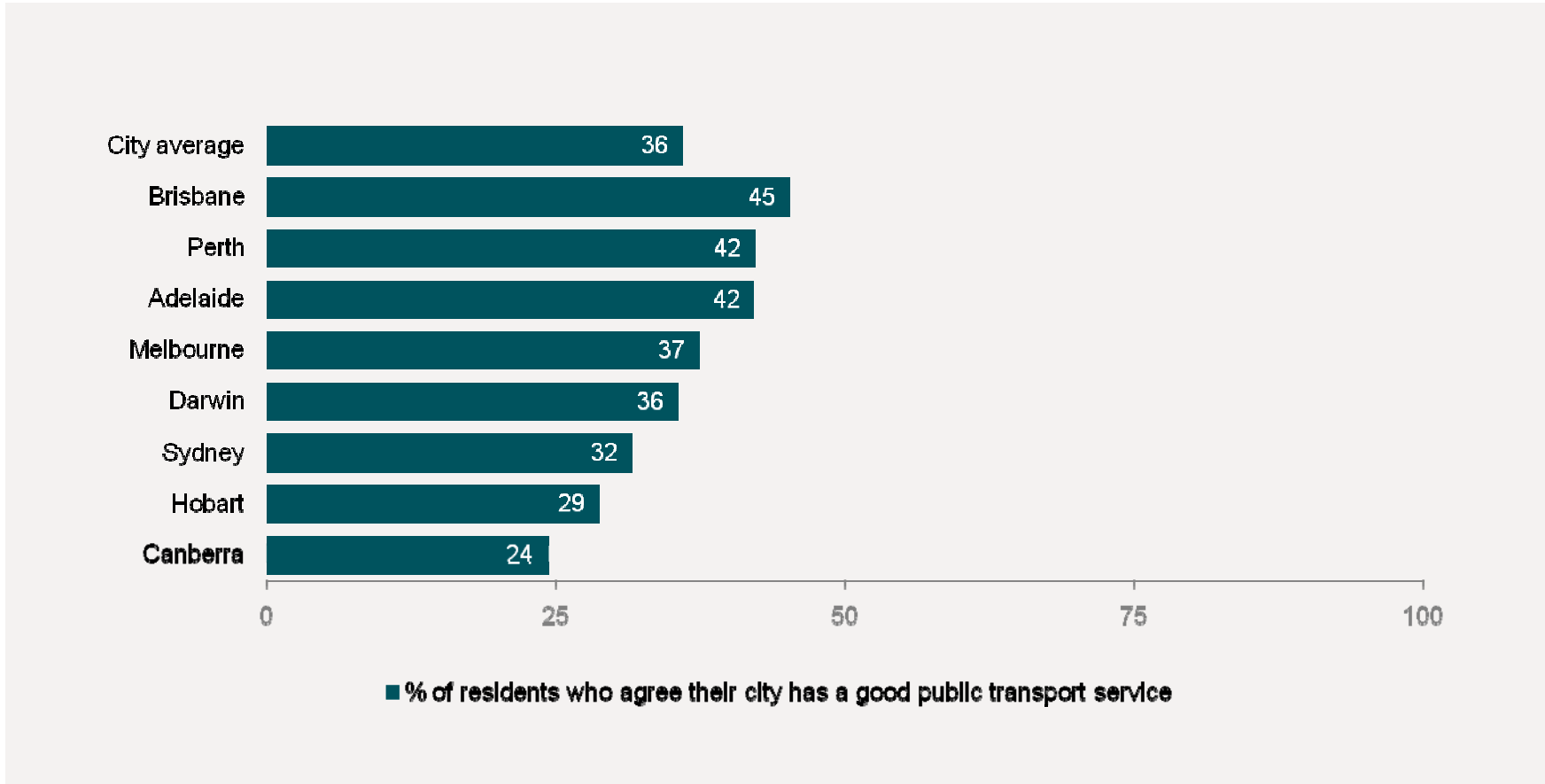
On average only 2 out of 5 respondents (42%) agree that their city is an affordable place to have a good standard of living. Results show stark variation in the performance of cities on this attribute with some cities performing far better than others. Almost three quarters of respondents in Adelaide agree their city is affordable while only a small minority of respondents in Sydney or Darwin agree.

Do residents believe their cities have a good road network and minimal traffic congestion?



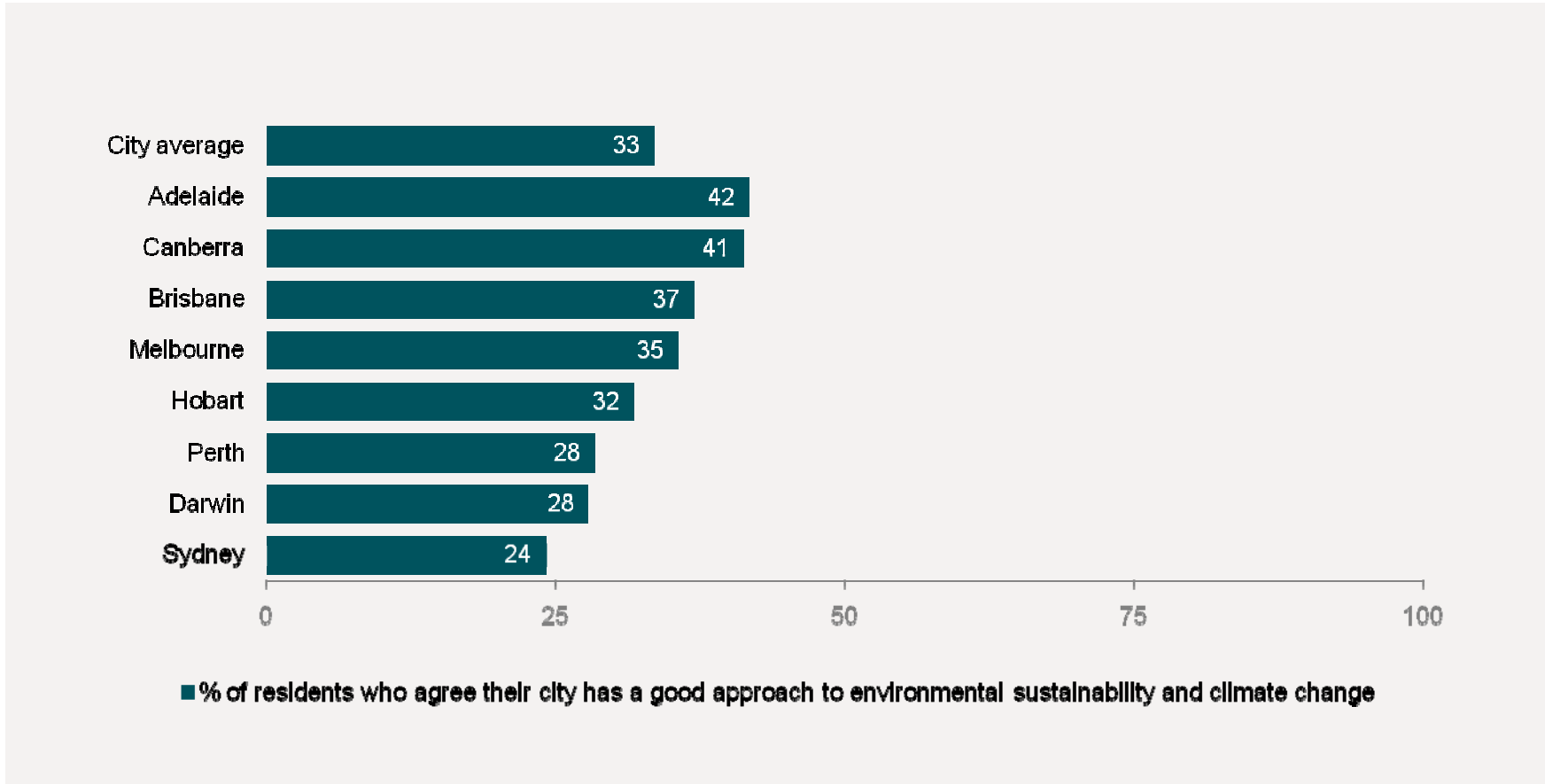
39% of respondents agree that their city has a good road network and minimal traffic congestion. There was considerable differences in the performance of cities on this attribute. Darwin and Canberra were seen as performing best, while only a minority of residents in Melbourne, Brisbane or Sydney agree that their city had a good road network with minimal traffic congestion.

Do residents believe their cities have a good public transport service?



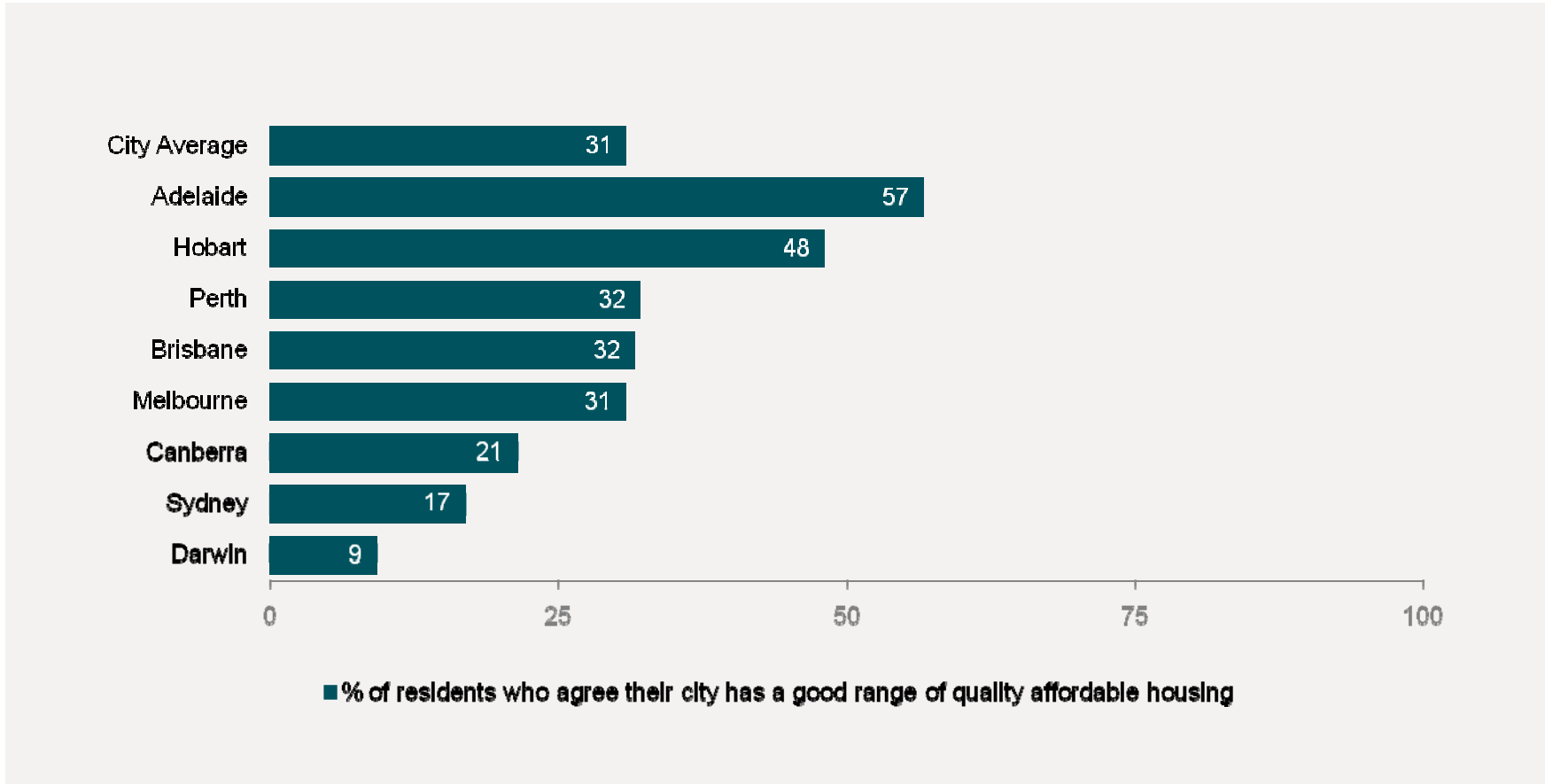
▶ On average only 36% of respondents agree that their city has a good public transport service. Overall, the performance of all cities on this attribute could be considered fair at best with none scoring over 50%. Brisbane performed best with 45% while Canberra (24%) and Hobart (29%) performed worst.

Do residents believe their cities have a good approach to environmental sustainability and climate change?



▶ A third of residents (33%) agree that their city has a good approach to environmental sustainability and climate change. Again, overall no city performed particularly well on this attribute with all scoring less than 50%. Adelaide and Canberra performed best on this attribute while Darwin and Sydney performed worst in this regard.

Do residents believe their cities have a good range of quality affordable housing?



On average less than a third (31%) of respondents agree that their city has a good range of quality affordable housing (making it the attribute on which cities performed the worst on). There were notable differences in the performance of cities on this attribute with some cities performing strongly and others scoring considerably below average. Adelaide and Hobart were seen as having the best range of quality affordable housing while, Darwin performed worst with only 9% of residents agreeing.
